

Strategy to Accomplishing Our Mission Statement

EVALUATE – But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of **knowing** Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith – **Philippians 3:7-9**

In reaching just 1 more student for the glory of God, we want that student to KNOW Christ Jesus as their all-sufficient Savior.

Grow – But **grow** in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen. – **2 Peter 3:18**

– And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the day drawing near. – Hebrews 10:24-25

In discipling just 1 more student for the glory of God, we want that student to GROW deeper in their relationship with Christ and other believers.

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

- Matthew 28:19-20

In sending out just 1 more student for the glory of God, we want that student to GO and make disciples in the steps of his/her everyday mission field.

CORE VALUES EXPECTATIONS

1. CrossPoint parents will take the primary responsibility for discipleship of students (Deuteronomy 6:4-9; Ephesians 6:1-4).

The primary minister in a young person's life is his/her parents. While it is true that student ministry is important, its role is not to assume the responsibility God has entrusted to the parents. Therefore, the staff of the student ministry will seek to partner with parents to support them in accomplishing the task God has given them. We will not assume the parents' role, but come along side to support, encourage and love them in this process.

2. The Word of God will be the foundation of all that we do (2 Tim 4:1-2; James 1:22-24; Psalm 119; 2 Timothy 3:15-17; John 17:17; 1 Thessalonians 2:13; Hebrews 4:12).

The Holy Spirit uses the Bible to transform lives. Without the centrality of scripture, ministry loses its focus and, as a result, opportunities for lasting spiritual impact are diminished or lost. Therefore, from start to finish, Scripture will remain foundational and permeate all that we do. We will focus our effort and energy in helping students see and embrace the truth of God in His Word.

3. The Gospel of Christ is the primary message. (John 14:1-6; Acts 4:12).

Games, events, and craziness of all kinds is great, but only when they work to accomplish the ultimate goal - *reaching just 1 more student for the glory of God*. For this reason, all that we do will be designed with salvation and Christ-likeness in mind. Our goal is not to entertain our young people or have the coolest, most cutting edge ministry in town, but to remain true to the gospel, trusting that God can and will change lives. We will do this by never assuming that our young people already have a sufficient understanding of the gospel and never exhorting the students to obey God's word apart from the gospel.

4. CrossPoint is the body of Christ and Her student ministry will learn and submit to the overall purpose of the church. (1 Corinthians 12, Ephesians 4:1-16; Colossians 3:15; Titus 2:6-8; 1 Peter 5:1-5).

The student ministry is not a separate church. Student ministry exists under the umbrella of Christ as the head of the Church, and the pastor who shepherds the church. Accordingly, we will teach our students what the Bible says about their responsibility to the church as a whole and encourage them to be involved in everything. We will take this involvement and identity with us as we declare "We Are CrossPoint" in all we say and do.

5. Every student will be encouraged to pursue accountability relationships where they can learn and grow alongside other believers (Luke 6:12-13; Matthew 18:15-20; Philippians 3:17; Hebrews 3:13).

There shouldn't be any "lone ranger" Christians. The Christian life is not to be lived in isolation. God has given believers the Body of Christ as a support system. For this reason we seek to connect our students to mature believers for the purpose of discipleship and accountability. This will be achieved by a weekly pursuit of developing a healthy community within the student ministry body.

6. We will speak the truth in love while being patient with all believers in the process of spiritual growth (1 Corinthians 3:5-8; Ephesians 5:17-24; Philippians 2:12-13; Romans 6:4; 2 Timothy 4:2).

There are differences between justification, sanctification and glorification. In justification God declares sinners righteous by crediting them with the perfect righteousness of Christ. This free gift is received by grace alone in faith alone by Christ alone. Sanctification is the process by which the Holy Spirit of God works godliness into the hearts and lives of believers. Glorification comes when we see Jesus face to face and are transformed into His very image. Whereas justification and glorification are instantaneous, sanctification is an on-going process that will never be fully completed or fully realized in this life. As with all of us, no student will ever be without sin on this earth. Therefore, we will seek to be patient with all students in the process of spiritual growth, believing that "He who began a good work in them will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus (Philippians 1:6 – paraphrased). In this process, we encourage all of our Bible study leaders and adult servants to do the same. 7. There will be no semblance of favoritism within the ministry because all students matter to God (Psalm 139:13-16; Luke 15; Luke 19:10; Romans 5:8; 1 Timothy 1:15-17; James 2:1-5; 2 Peter 3:9).

Each student is fearfully and wonderfully made and unique in God's eyes. Regardless of dress, lifestyle, or personal background, God loves each student equally. Therefore, we will seek to demonstrate that same love through fairness and impartiality. We will encourage each student to interact freely and openly with each other, while discouraging "cliques" of any kind. We will remain equally accessible to everyone.

SET-UP

FUNCTION

Bible Study exists for the purpose of growing students in godliness through the study of the Word while also growing students in community with their leaders and peers. Bible Study provides accountability and encouragement for students to continue becoming the men and women God has called them to be.

BIBLE STUDY LEADERS

Our leaders are trained quarterly. We understand that not all leaders desire to teach, therefore, some of our leaders serve in other areas such as outreach and hospitality. Every group of leaders is asked to host a Bible Study get-together once a semester. Additionally, all of our leaders are required to complete an online child protection seminar.

MEETING TIMES

• <u>9:15 MIDDLE SCHOOL</u> • <u>10:45 HIGH SCHOOL</u>

Everyone meets together at the beginning of the hour to worship through song, hear announcements, and participate in an activity. Afterwards, students break into their Bible Study groups which are separated into grade and gender. These groups are lead by a team of adult leaders.

CURRICULUM - THE JESUS STUDIES

Our curriculum is "Jesus Studies" which focuses on certain topics that teenagers deal with (stress, friendships, culture, etc.) and seeks to understand how Scripture addresses these topics. We will study the Bible together and dialogue about how to live wisely in each of these areas.

GUATEMALA

- March 20th-28th, 2020
- Open to 10th-12th grade students
- Estimated cost: \$1,330.00

CrossPoint partners with Mision Vida Nueva in Guatemela. They have built a Christ-centered, government-accredited children's home in the poorest department, Alta Verapaz. Casa Gloria is home and family to children and babies who have been orphaned, abandoned, or abused. Living to Serve is another Guatemalan ministry that we partner with to share the love of Christ through educational and health programs in rural villages.

BAHAMAS

- <u>March 21st-27th, 2020</u>
- Open to 9th-12th grade students
- Estimated cost: \$750.00

The high school ministry will be traveling to the Bahamas during Spring Break to assist local church pastors in ministering to the lost in their community. The ministry opportunities could include backyard Bible clubs, sports camps, administering food and supplies, and construction. The trip dates are March 21st – 27th and is open to 9th-12th graders. The student ministry worship team is comprised of students in grades 7-12. They meet week to week on Sunday afternoons to rehearse new music. Some students play instruments such as piano, drums, Cajon, and guitar while others sing. They meet to practice and perform, but this is not the ultimate goal. The goal is to use the gifts and talents the Lord has given them to point to Christ and lead other believers in worship. Every student involved is a member and faithful attender of CrossPoint as well as a devoted follower of Jesus Christ.

ENCOURAGING NOTES

Encouraging Notes is an opportunity to write a letter to someone who needs uplifting or encouragement in their life. The students have the chance to serve the Lord through this ministry by showing love to our church family and others. Our students come every Wednesday night after worship to serve faithfully. *1 Corinthians 13:13*

• This is available to all students. Encouraging notes meets in Room 102 after worship every Wednesday night.

GAME TEAM

Servants on this team will be responsible for the planning and implementation of games and crowd activities that engage students on Wednesday nights and on various trips and events.

• This is available to students in 8th -12th grade.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SET-UP TEAM

Servants on this team will be responsible for organizing and setting up the Student Worship Room for worship on Wednesday nights. They will also aid the Student ministry in other ministry tasks.

• This is available to students in 8th -12th grade.

MEDIA TEAM

Our media team runs the computer, lights, and sound for our Sunday and Wednesday services and special events. Students are trained on all of the equipment and are led by adult volunteers. This is a great way for students to serve the student ministry.

SERVICEOPPORTUNITIES



BIBLE STUDY LEADER

We strive to keep three servants for each class. One servant will be in charge of teaching and delegating most Sundays. A second servant will plan and facilitate events that the Bible study groups will participate in, such as service projects and fun activities. The third servant will lead the outreach/care team, making sure encouraging notes are sent to students and guests when needed. This will be a weekly commitment.

GREET TEAM

Servants on this team commit to greet regular attenders and guests on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights. They also commit to helping guests connect with other students.

MEDIA TEAM

Adults and students serve in the sound booth running the sound board, light show, and computer. There will be three servants running media at all times on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights. This will be a once a month commitment.

TRIP CHAPERONES

Servants in this position are adults willing to be a chaperone on weeklong or day trips. We need multiple adults, so the responsibility does not fall on the same adults for each trip.

EVENT HELP

DNow Host Home

Part of our Disciple Now weekend is having students stay at host homes for their grade and gender. Each year we need families to open their homes to these students for Friday and Saturday night. This is a fun opportunity to serve and use your home as a ministry tool. Homes are responsible for getting their students to and from the house and the church (help can be provided, if needed). Homes are also responsible for breakfast and lunch on Saturday!

• <u>Driver</u>

For many of our trips or day events, we use the church buses or vans. We need volunteers who are willing to drive students either in the bus or in their own vehicle.

<u>Trip Food Team</u>

On our Winter Retreat and Mission Trip we take our own CrossPoint Cook Team. This team prepares all of the meals for the students during the trip. This is a great opportunity to serve if you enjoy cooking and hanging out with our students.

(These are some examples of Event Help, not an exhaustive list)

VIDEO/PROMO TEAM - SET DESIGN

Servants on this team are willing to take pictures for various events and trips and aid in the brainstorming and implementation of promotional videos and set designs for DNow and Wednesday night series.

COFFEE HOUSE TEAM

Servants on this team commit to aid in the organization and running of our student store and coffee shop.

BREAKFAST TEAM

This team is made up of servants willing to aid in the scheduling, communication, and implementation of big breakfast for students on the fourth Sunday of the month.

NOTE: Each adult servant will need to fill out a servant application, pass a background check prior to serving, and be willing to complete other training requirements.

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POLICIESandPROCEDURES

INAPPROPRIATE DISPLAYS OF AFFECTION

- · Any form of sexual contact or contact perceived as stimulating
- Intimate kissing
- Initiating full frontal hugs or "bear hugs"
- Massages
- Lying down or sleeping beside students
- Tickling or wrestling
- Touching or hugging from behind
- Showing affection in isolated/inappropriate areas such as bedrooms, closets, restricted or private rooms
- · Comments that relate to physique or body development
- Patting on the thigh, knee or leg
- Inappropriate or lengthy embraces
- Piggyback rides

APPROPRIATE DISPLAYS OF AFFECTION

Use of appropriate physical contact in a public setting to show support, encouragement and healthy affection toward students who are receptive to this form of emotional expression is acceptable. However, adults must exercise good judgment and never force any physical contact on any students. Examples of appropriate displays of affection may include:

- Holding hands during prayers
- Side-hugs
- Hand-shakes
- High-fives, hand slaps and fist bumps
- Verbal praise
- Arms around shoulders
- Pats on the shoulder/upper back

APPROPRIATE DISCIPLINE

Adults will employ only positive methods of discipline and guidance that encourages, builds self-esteem, self-control and self-direction. Examples of positive discipline include:

- Using praise and encouragement of good behavior instead of focusing only upon unacceptable behavior
- Reminding students of behavior expectations by using clear and positive statements
- Redirecting behavior using positive statements
- Using brief supervised separation or time out from the group, when appropriate for the student's age and development.

If a student is deemed to be out of control or unapologetically disrespectful, a parent or legal guardian will be notified. Harsh, cruel or unusual treatment under the guise of discipline is unacceptable and will not be tolerated.

adult servant guidelines

GENERAL

Adults involved in CrossPoint Church Student Ministry activities must assume the full burden for setting and maintaining clear and appropriate physical and emotional boundaries in all Student Ministry relationships.

TWO ADULT RULE

Two or more adults are to be present during any CrossPoint Church sponsored Student Ministry activity. If one-on-one interactions between adults and students are unavoidable or absolutely necessary, the interaction should occur in an area that is visible to others and with the knowledge of another adult. No adults or college leaders will have sole responsibility for, or be alone with, any student. Where application of this rule is not possible or practical (e.g. emergencies) a "roaming adult" should be utilized. Student Ministry activities that cannot meet requirements of the two-adult rule will be cancelled.

PROPORTIONAL ADULT COVERAGE/SUPERVISION

It is recommended that there be a minimum of 1 adult per 6-7 students for high school level activities, 1 Adult per 5-6 students for middle school age activities. Per the two-adult rule, no activity will have less than two adults, preferably one male and one female if mixed gender students are participating.

OFF SITE ACTIVITES

It is preferable that one or more of the accompanying adults be parents/guardians of participants for Student Ministry trips.

TRANSPORTATION

All students must ride in vehicles driven by authorized adults which must:

- Be at least 25 years old (or have written permission from parents for anyone younger than this age)
- Have a valid Alabama driver's license, qualified for the vehicle being operated.
- Must be under the church insurance if driving a church vehicle.
- Have proof of personal driving insurance.
- Never be alone in a vehicle with a student other than his/her own child. Therefore, no fewer than three persons, one of them an adult, should occupy a vehicle traveling to/from an activity.
- Ensure vehicles are not filled beyond capacity for their use that seat belts are always secured and that occupants behave.
- Must understand emergency contact procedures and maintain contact with the person in charge (e.g. cell phone).





OVERNIGHT EVENTS

- Care needs to be taken to ensure that there is a clean, safe environment provide for sleeping, showering, bathing, dressing and all other aspects of being away for a period of time. Adults must always respect the privacy of students and each other. Likewise students must respect the privacy of adults and each other.
- When the Student Ministry includes both males and females, and stays overnight, both male and female adults must be present. (This also applies to overnight stays at CrossPoint Church)
- Only CrossPoint Church and associated congregational group, students and adults participating in the trip are allowed to stay in the same accommodations unless the trip is geared toward multi church collaboration.
- Sleeping areas and access to bathroom facilities should be segregated between males and females. Every sleeping unit (hotel room, dorm room, cabin, tent, etc) should have either two adults of the same gender as the youth, or no adults assigned to it. In the rarest of cases when only one adult is available, the sleeping unit must have at least two students of the same gender as the adult. Adults are not allowed to share a bed with a student unless it is their own child. If absolutely necessary, beds may be shared by students of the same gender. If separate bathroom facilities are not available, times for male and female and students/adults use should be scheduled and posted prominently.
- When one room is used for sleeping, students and adults of the opposite gender will sleep an appropriate distance apart as determined by the adult in charge.
- Both students and adults shall wear appropriate sleeping apparel.
- In booking hotel rooms, reservations should be made, if possible, with all rooms on the same floor or location in the hotel. Adjacent rooms allow for enhanced supervision and safety.
- No students should be allowed to leave the premises without authorized and appropriate adult supervision.
- Curfews must be established and adhered to by all participants. The curfews are set within the schedule provided for the particular trip or event.

FORMS/RELEASES

• Medical Forms, Insurance Forms, Parental Consent/Permission Slips, Waivers & Releases, will be filed, maintained and secured in the church office.

INJURY & FIRST AID

- We can administer ONLY band-aids and ice packs. We will consult with a parent for any further needs. We aim to have a nurse attend each trip or event.
- If a student participant is injured while under our supervision, the adult servant in charge will immediately notify the student staff. The staff then will be responsible for notifying the student's parents. All injuries must be reported no matter how insignificant or minor they may seem.

EXCEPTIONAL SITUATIONS

- Only under the rarest and most unusual circumstances should an adult be alone in a car, room or other accommodation with a student. This might include a case where a student is ill or in a bona fide medical emergency. In this case, the adult should make every effort toenlist the help of another student or adult to be present and assist. Note however, the welfare of the student takes precedence and whatever action is necessary and appropriate must be taken.
- If there is a unique need for an adult to talk with a student in private, the adult should choose a quiet place that is in plain, public view. Examples of this may include open areas around the church (courtyards or hotel lobbies if on a trip), short walks down a sidewalk, a restaurant or other location where people are present in the area.
- Adults need to acknowledge that there is potential for sexual abuse and/or harassment by outside parties and must take reasonable and appropriate steps to ensure the safety and well-being of all students.

SCREENING

- Each adult servant is required to complete an application process which includes a personal interview and a criminal background check.
- Each adult servant must be a member of CrossPoint Church. Each Bible study leader will be trained annually by the student staff.

REPORTING

- Any person, adult or youth, must be ready to safeguard and protect the trust and safety of children and student. Anyone who has "reason to believe" or evidence that a child/student is a victim of abuse or neglect has a duty to report. This duty to report is not limited to events or activities at CrossPoint Church or under our supervision. A failure to report can be considered a criminal offense and potentially subject to civil liability.
- CrossPoint Church understands that appropriate government agencies must respond and investigate reports of abuse/neglect of a child/student to the Alabama Department of Human Resources. CrossPoint Church will at all times fully cooperate with such governmental agencies, and in no way attempt to interfere in or obstruct such agencies or their investigations.
- If anyone is unsure whether an incident or condition should be reported, they should feel free to discuss the circumstances with the Minister of Students or the Executive Pastor. Additionally, CrossPoint Church asks that if an incident or condition is reported to the Alabama Department of Human Resources that the Minister of Students and the Executive Pastor be notified of the situation.

COUNSELING

Bear in mind, Student Ministry staff are not professional counselors. Consequently this occasionally poses a significant boundary issue when working with students. As they begin to trust the Student Ministry staff, they will begin to confide in them. Problems arise when a student confides in a volunteer, expecting them to maintain confidentiality. Unfortunately, not all counseling issues can remain confidential. Student Ministry servants are required to report immediately to the student staff if:

- A young person is being abused sexually
- A young person is threatening to hurt him/herself (suicide, cutting, etc)
- A young person is threatening to hurt someone else (homicide, revenge, etc)
- A young person reveals a personal crisis/endangerment (pregnancy, drug abuse addictions, criminal activity, etc).

*If any of these situations arise, the student staff will take the appropriate course of action, including the consulting of authorities and/ or parents or pursuing professional counseling options. The student staff is available to give counsel and guidance on any issues or Concerns that arise. Because we are dealing with minors, we will use the utmost discretion as to who to involve in various issues. We desire to build trust with our young people, but not to the extent of keeping parents excluded from their child's life. Counseling appointments with student staff will not exceed past three meetings. If a fourth meeting is needed, a professional counselor will be recommended.

DRESSCODE

At CrossPoint, we are all part of an environment where we are trying to remove distractions so that we can concentrate bringing God the glory. We do not want any student or adult to distract others by the way they dress, or to be distracted by the way others dress. Should you choose to draw attention to yourself by dressing inappropriately, **you will be asked to change your clothes**.

Dress should be representative of who we are as Christian students and adults. (Please note: This dress code applies mainly to our students who are church members and those that attend often. We want them to set the example. However, we will be sensitive to guests and will address dress code violations with more grace.)

the rules

- Any clothing or accessory that is deemed inappropriate by a staff member or ministry leader is prohibited.
- Students are to wear clothing in the manner for which it is designed. No clothing shall be worn inside out; suspenders/braces shall be fastened and belts buckled.
 Pants must be worn at the waist.
- Sun dresses and backless dresses or tops should be worn with a jacket or appropriate covering. (Jacket or covering may not be sheer or mesh).
- Cutoff tops, tank tops, and mesh tops can be worn if a t-shirt with sleeves is worn underneath or another shirt is worn over the top. (Cover shirt or undershirt may not be sheer or mesh).
- Students must wear proper undergarments.
- Pajama tops, pants, or house shoes are not allowed.
- Halter tops, tube tops, and midriff tops are not allowed. Midriffs and sides must be covered while standing or seated.
- Insignias, buttons, and clothing which are suggestive of wine, beer, whiskey, tobacco, vulgarities and violence, are drug-related, or are demeaning to other persons may not be worn.

- All clothing must be clean and have no holes above the knee that reveal skin or underclothes.
- Sweat pants and jogging pants are allowed as long as they are properly fitted.
- Skirts and shorts must not be shorter than four inches above the knee in the front and back. Skirts and shorts that are worn with leggings or tights underneath must still meet the dress code length. Yoga pants, running tights and similar tight fitting pants must be worn with a shirt or dress that also meets the dress code length.
- Clothing shall not be so tight, so loose or so low cut as to be overly revealing while standing or seated, causing a disruption to the school environment or a safety concern.
- Shirts should be long enough so as not to ride up in the front or back while seated to reveal midriff area or underclothes.
- Cover up! Girl Swimsuit rules! If you have a Bikini please cover with a dark t-shirt. If you have a one piece swimsuit that is low cut and is revealing cleavage, wear a dark t-shirt. Tankinis are ok, but observe the no bare midriffs rule above.
- Guys swimsuit rules! No jean cut off shorts for swimming. No Speedo bottoms. Must be appropriate.
