

A Letter from Buck

Dear CrossPoint,

This is a momentous day in the life of CrossPoint. Seventeen years ago, the Lord created this family of faith and instilled within it a heart for ministry and missions. Since that time, the church has faithfully pursued the vision of reaching JUST ONE MORE and God has faithfully provided the necessary resources. However, during that time, there has always been the promise of a day when God would throw open the windows of heaven pour out His provision like never before in the life of this congregation. I believe that day is upon us. For the first time, we are debt free!

You have trusted in the Lord as you gave generously, and He has provided abundantly. Even amid a global pandemic, you gave a record \$357,151 to the Missions Stream in 2021. Because of your continued generosity, CrossPoint was able to continue its support of missionaries all over the world through the International Mission Board and church planters through the North American Mission Board. We were also able to support CrossPointers as they responded to a call to missions, including Taylor and Lydia Whitley (Germany), Lauren Stearns (Germany), Michaela Hunter (Uganda) and Gina Leonardi (Guatemala). For the first time since the onset of the pandemic, we sent teams into the field on shortterm mission trips to Guatemala and Atlanta. We touched the nations with the love and message of Christ as we increased our participation in Operation Christmas Child by over 200%. We continued to support local ministries, including The WellHouse, Alabama Baptist Children's Homes and Birmingham Metro Baptist Association Disaster Relief. Through God's provision and your generosity, we truly participated in taking the gospel HERE, THERE and **EVERYWHERE** in 2021.

However, the faithfulness of God in the past should only prove to grow our faith and expectation for what He will do through us now. As we enter the mission field debt-free, we do so expecting the Lord to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think. The opportunities are limitless. As the Lord wills in 2022, we will seek to take the gospel of Jesus Christ **TO THE END OF THE EARTH!**

TROSSPOINT 2021 IN REVIEW

Highlights in 2021:

- CrossPointers travelled internationally (Guatemala) and domestically (Atlanta and Clarkston, GA) on mission for the first time since the beginning of the pandemic.
- CrossPoint commissioned Lauren Stearns as a missionary to assist with church planting efforts in Berlin, Germany.
- Taylor and Lydia Whitley relocated to begin planting a church in Berlin, Germany.
- Gina Leonardi served as a mission intern for two months at Casa Gloria in Guatemala.

- Over 50 CrossPoint students participated in two serve days with various ministries, including The WellHouse, Lovelady Center, Center Point Backpack Buddies and Stitches of Grace.
- CrossPoint Construction Ministry assisted in the completion of a chapel and children's home at the WellHouse.
- CrossPointers packed 1,400 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes and collected an additional 3,470 shoeboxes serving as an area collection site.
- Assisted with various needs of our mission partners around the world by providing Bibles in Pakistan, funding food pantries in Romania and sponsoring air-time for radio ministry in Peru.
- CrossPointers gave over \$350,000 to the Missions Stream (breakdown below).

SAMARITAN'S PURSE

CrossPoint's participation in Operation Christmas Child increased by over 200% in 2021! The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to children in need around the world. Through this project, Samaritan's Purse partners with the local church worldwide to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and make disciples of the nations. Since 1993, more than 188 million children in more than 170 countries and territories have received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox. Through this ministry, more than 12.5 million boys and girls have made a decision to follow Christ.

CrossPoint has participated in Operation Christmas Child for years; however, in 2021, new opportunities were presented to us that allowed for greater engagement with this global gospel ministry. Through a joint-effort by Bible Study Groups across the church, we were able to pack over 1,000 shoeboxes in one day to be distributed to hard-to-reach areas of the world. Additional boxes were built by senior adults, adults, students and children for a grand total of 1,400 shoeboxes packed by CrossPointers in 2021!

Again this year, we were privileged to serve as an area collection site for Operation Christmas Child. Through this ministry, volunteers were able to collect an additional 3,470 shoeboxes from area churches, business and individuals. Each drop-off provided an opportunity to pray with one of our neighbors and seek out potential gospel conversations.

Missions Stream Goal


New Goal, New Allocation, Increased Impact!

The Missions Stream is one of the three streams in CrossPoint's River of Stewardship. The goal for 2022 has been increased from \$350,000 in 2021, to \$500,000 in 2022, and \$500,000 in 2023. That means CrossPoint will give \$1,000,000 over the next two years to this stream! Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Along with the new goal, our teams have adjusted our percentage allocations to include 40% to International Missions, 25% to North American Missions, and 35% to CrossPoint Direct Missions. That means that by the end of 2023 we will give \$400,000 to International Missions, \$250,000 to North American Missions and we will have \$350,000 available for CrossPoint Direct Mission initiatives. The increased goals and these updated percentages will result in significant increases in all three categories... **WOW!**

As a member of CrossPoint, you have the flexibility to give to missions at your own pace. You can give weekly, monthly, or annually to support these exciting mission opportunities based on your personal cash flow patterns. You can also teach your family to generously give to missions. What an opportunity we have as a church family and what an opportunity you have as an individual or as a family to join God where He is working at home and around the world! 

At CrossPoint, every member is a minister in the church and is called to be a missionary in the world. There are various ways to answer this missionary calling as a CrossPointer. To begin with, we must PRAY. We are instructed in the Bible to pray for our brothers and sisters in the mission field (2 Corinthians 1:11). We must cover our Mission Partners in prayer so that they will be strengthened in the midst of spiritual battles and so that the Word of the Lord will speed ahead with clarity and conviction. Secondly, we must GIVE. At CrossPoint, we are encouraged to give generously above our tithes to the Missions and Manna Streams. As a new debt-free day dawns for our church, we are looking for God to open unimaginable new doors for ministry and missions through your generous giving. Finally, we must **GO**.

The opportunities to engage with our Mission Partners face-to-face, to encourage them and to serve alongside them are ever-expanding. Many of you have had the blessing of going on mission for the sake of the gospel. Others are curious but are not sure where to begin. Here are several ways to go on mission:

Short-Term Mission Team Leader - The Leader has been actively involved in missions historically and feels led to take on a leadership role with one of our existing mission teams or to lead a new mission endeavor. The Leader's primary responsibility is to disciple and pray for those on your mission team. The Leader is also responsible for recruiting and training team members, working with the Minister of Missions and Mission Partner to finalize trip logistics, preparing the team for the trip, supervising the team while on the field, ensuring the financial responsibilities of the team are met and documented, and reporting on the trip upon the team's return.



WAYS TO BE MORE INVOLVED

Short-Term Mission Team Member – The Member may or may not have missions experience, but acknowledges the Biblical calling to take the gospel to the nations. All Team Members are expected to prayerfully seek to live out their CrossPoint Membership Covenant while on mission by protecting the unity of the team, sharing the responsibility of the team, serving the ministry of the team, supporting the finances of the team and enhancing the testimony of the team.

Mission Point Partner – Point Partners actively support CrossPoint's Mission Partners and Short-Term Mission Teams through prayer and encouragement. Point Partners are responsible for maintaining regular contact with our Mission Partners, communicating with our Short-Term Mission Team Leaders (if applicable) on matters relating to our Mission Partners, coordinating regular times of prayer for our Mission Partners and actively encouraging our Mission Partners through cards, notes, emails or other means.



WHAT ROLE DOES PRAYER PLAY IN CHURCH PLANTING?

The answer is simple, a lot!

Lydia named 2021 the year of transition. During this year we completed a two-year church planting training, welcomed our second son Caleb Ezekiel into this world, spent three months visiting family and raising support in the USA, and then, moved to another city. Why all the transition? So, we can start a new church planting project in Berlin.

Unless this is your first week at CrossPoint, you've probably heard something about this project. Working in partnership with the International Baptist Church of Berlin, our goal is to invite people from all nations living in Berlin to walk with Jesus. A lot of thought, planning, preparation, and training go into such a project. Without a doubt, however, the most important aspect of our work is **prayer**.

Prayer, at its most basic sense, is a conversation with God. It's taking time out of the hustle and bustle of everyday life to interact with the Creator of the world. It's speaking, listening, petitioning, and receiving. We pray before meals, in preparation for a great task, when we feel thankful, when we feel troubled, in worship, and even in the small pauses during the day.

Both as a family and individually Lydia, Luke, Caleb, and I pray about the church plant. Sometimes we pray for us: that God would equip, prepare, enable, and empower us to be effective in our work. Sometimes we pray for others: for our neighbors, friends, colleagues, and people we will meet and share Jesus with this year. Sometimes we pray for the results: that God would establish the work of our hands, that people would meet and begin a relationship with Jesus, and that God's kingdom would expand in Berlin.

Amazingly, many of you pray for this project too! CrossPoint, you prayed for us during our time in Alabama both corporately and individually. We regularly receive letters, emails, texts, and notes with your prayers for us. Your prayers strengthen, embolden, and uphold us. We cannot thank you enough for your prayers!

But why pray? After all, if we believe what the Bible says, God already knows our thoughts, actions, and words (**Psalm 139:1-4**). He already has a plan for us and does whatever he pleases (**Psalm 115:3**). So, what's the point?

According to the Gospel of John, we pray because God desires our prayers. Jesus said in **John 15:7-8**, "But if you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask for anything you want, and it will be granted! When you produce much fruit, you are my true disciples. This brings great glory to my Father."

We pray to be near to God through Jesus. We pray to ask God to work in our lives. We pray because we are disciples of Christ. And when we do these things, God receives great glory!

God already answered so many of our prayers. He provided us with an amazing team member for the project, Lauren Stearns. He blessed us with a supportive partner church who continues to help us physically during our transition. He provided us an apartment in the exact location we've prayed for. He provides the financial support through his people to enable the work. What a blessing! God provides for us far more abundantly than we could ever ask or imagine. To God be the glory!

So what are you praying about? What glory could God receive if you would spend more time with him in prayer? Set aside some specific time this week for prayer. Ask God to help us in our work in Berlin. Ask him to help you in your daily life. Take time to be silent and listen to the Holy Spirit. By doing so, we will produce much fruit that brings glory to God!

Every summer, the Ministry Center partners with Clarkston International Bible Church to host Camp Encounter where an average of 100 campers a day from around the world are able to encounter our faithful God as they learn about the Gospel. High-school age and up are able to serve

To the Person Who Wonders if They are Called to Foreign Missions...

I remember being in high school and wondering what I was going to do with my life. There is a lot of pressure to decide where you go to school, what job to have, and ultimately who you want to be. I had my sights set on something in the medical or engineering fields. It wasn't until I went on a mission trip to the Dominican Republic that I started to question that trajectory.

Before I went on the trip, I had been experiencing a lot of stress and anxiety in my life. I remember landing in the DR and instantly feeling a sense of peace. I know the Lord was with me and was giving me the comfort to pause, look around, and question what I thought my life would become. After a week in the DR, I felt enough conviction to stop and really consider if the Lord was wanting me to shift from my current plan to a life of ministry and mission.

I prayed, journaled, and sought the counsel of the student staff. At the end of a discernment period, I really felt like God wanted me to shift my focus and lean into a life of ministry. The beginning of the story sounds so clear. It seems like God very clearly told me that He wanted me to do this, and in many ways He did. It didn't just happen overnight, though. It took years for me to develop my "calling" and learn more specifically where and how God wanted me to serve.

The trip to the DR was special because it opened my eyes to an opportunity I had not considered before. It was the jolt I needed to cause me to slow down my pace a bit and question where I was heading. It's not like having a career in medicine or engineering is a bad thing. There are certainly many ways to glorify God and share the gospel in those fields, or in any field for that matter. The thing is, that's not what God wanted me to do. I felt Him very clearly telling me that He wanted me to pursue ministry and missions as a vocation.



That initial trip opened my eyes to the possibilities of what God could do, but it wasn't until I started surrounding myself with and investing in the international community in Birmingham that I began to see both the need and beauty of missions in an entirely new way. As I began to make friends with people from different countries, I began to see a) their need for the gospel and b) how beautiful the kingdom of God is when many different countries and cultures are represented. I had so much to learn about hospitality from my Middle Eastern friends. I had so much to learn about justice from my European friends. I had so much to learn about prayer from my African friends. The list goes on and on. I had to understand that the global Church looks very different from the churches I grew up around. Praise God for CrossPoint. Praise God that CrossPoint cares about seeing the gospel go forth into the world. Praise God that CrossPoint is a faithful part of the kingdom of God, but I needed to learn more about other cultures and peoples to open my eyes to some of the things I might have been missing. I needed to expand my view of the Church in order to see just how gracious and powerful our God is, to see just how worthy He is of all praise and honor and glory.

If you are wondering if God is calling you to foreign missions, I would invite you to pray. I would invite you to step out of your comfort zone and learn more about other cultures- not just about the areas they need help in but also about how you could learn from them. I would invite you to take a moment to look around and ask vourself if you are willing and able to go. Many are willing but not able. Many are also able but not willing. A life of ministry and mission involves sacrifice, but that sacrifice is well worth the reward of standing next to your new brothers and sisters singing praises to our God at His throne. To worship with peoples of all tribes and nations and languages, we have to be willing to go to those tribes and nations and languages that they may hear the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The question is, if God says, "Go" are you ready to do it?

I began serving in Bundibugyo, Uganda at the end of 2020 as a Missionary Kid Teacher. Throughout the past year, God has been with me and encouraging me to learn language, speaking through me to those around me who are living difficult lives and helping me to see how capable I am because of the ways I am able to depend on Him. Fear of the unknown has often stopped me from pursuing difficult things, but the more I see God's hand in my life, the more I am able to trust Him in all areas of my life. I wanted to share a few ways God has led me to where I am today.

At the beginning of 2019, a few teachers from a school in Uganda visited my university. These were courageous Ugandan men and women who are passionate about teaching. I was moved by the fire in their hearts and God put a desire in my heart to learn more. During their last day with us, one of my friends ran up to me and asked if I would go with her to Uganda over the summer. My mind raced with fear, anxiety and excuses for why I couldn't go. In that moment, God reached out and helped replace these fears with courage. That summer, I went to teach in their school. Those experiences allowed me to depend more on God and created a desire to be close with him. When I returned from Uganda at the end of the summer, I felt God calling me overseas long term. He was calling me towards a difficult place to fill a need in a rural part of the world. I felt terrified. I knew I had been overseas once, but could I move there long term? How could I move away from all of my family and friends?

As I was talking with my sending agency, Serge, about moving, I continued to have feelings of doubt. I had heard missionaries speak and didn't believe I was knowledgeable enough or spiritually mature enough to be a missionary. A friend of mine advised me to read more about Moses. Moses did not feel capable as a speaker and even asked God to send someone else. God gave him sign after sign and Moses continued to doubt. Moses was far from perfect, yet God used Him in mighty ways. We often forget this part of Moses' story. We think of him as someone who loved God deeply and depended on him through everything. When in fact, God worked in him and through him for a long time and it deepened Moses' love for God.

One of Serge's core values is ministry through weakness. It is through our weaknesses that we are able to see the grace of God. It is true that God gives us gifts and He uses those gifts, but we are still imperfect humans. It is only when we realize this truth that we are able to truly rely on God's power instead of our own efforts. Moses may have guided the Israelites out of Egypt, but it was only through God's power that Moses was able to do this. God could have called anyone to Bundibugyo, Uganda to serve, but He chose my teammates and I and works in us and through us each day.

We are not perfect, but it is through our imperfections and weaknesses that we are able to minister to others to show them God's perfect love.


Jesse and I knew well before we met that God was calling us to something outside of Birmingham. Independently we sought out mission opportunities across the country and ultimately across the world, many of which we have you, CrossPoint, to thank for. After getting married we waited on God's timing and provision to show us where he was going to plant us. Waiting wasn't easy, we sought answers in multiple places, Fairbanks (Alaska), Reykjavik (Iceland), Asia and Central America. At every turn we encountered closed doors, hard lessons in waiting patiently. Then God brought us to the Castello's home and we learned about Boston. Boston was so different from the work we were looking for in places that played to our strengths and giftings. Boston called on us to lay down those strengths and abilities, and helped us to pick up a deeper, fuller dependence on God's ability to provide.

Transitioning from a large church to a church plant that's smaller than the World's Greatest Sunday School Class was a big step. There was no place to hide in the crowd, and it stretched us to grow both emotionally and spiritually. City on a Hill - Forest Hills is the church we were called to help plant. It's a church in a network of neighborhood churches that's mission is to lead people to love, trust, and follow Jesus in everyday life. An actionable goal in a city where fewer than 3.5% of the population claim to be evangelical. Boston is one of the most diverse cities in our country, with students from more than 130 countries represented. This diversity gave us the opportunity to grow in how we love and support our neighbors. It forced us to grow comfortable beyond our comfort zones, in ways that only God could have led us through.

Some of the biggest lessons we learned being in a church plant revolve around community. We quickly learned that true Gospel centered community doesn't appear overnight. We have had the amazing opportunity to delve into one another's lives for both accountability and encouragement. Sometimes it is full of laughter, meeting up to tell stories over dinner while other times it is sitting at Children's Hospital with your neighbor's ill child. We have also seen Gospel centered community tear down the walls that society so often builds for us. We have had the opportunity to build lasting relationships with brothers and sisters from all walks of life and learn that community means different things to people from different traditions. We have learned how to put aside the things that made us different and faithfully pursue the people in our church community for the sake of the Gospel.

To sum it up, it's been an adventure, but we expected nothing less. Change is hard especially when it involves leaving all the knowns and comforts of your life to pursue a calling. New neighborhoods, new jobs, and new communities can instill uncertainty, but what we have found time and time again is that our God is unchanging, ever faithful to care for his children. When stepping out on faith there will be terrifying times. When we go through those times we cling to the promises of Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and he will make straight your paths." And Joshua 1:9 "...Do not be frightened and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."
